Stephen Christian Lynch, of Williamsburg Virginia, age 49, died unexpectedly March 1, 2019. Stephen was born in Gloucester Point Virginia and was a graduate of Gloucester High School. Stephen graduated from the College of William & Mary with a B.A. Degree and worked for several years for Colonial Williamsburg. He subsequently graduated from ECPI with a Computer Systems Programmer certificate and Riverside College of Health Careers with AAS degree as a Physical Therapist Assistant and worked for Riverside Health System.
